This responsible procurement policy aims to ensure that all SMTI procurement processes are conducted ethically, sustainably, and transparently, by integrating economic, social, and environmental criteria into our decisions.

3. Guiding Principles:

We are committed to promoting:

- Respect for human rights and working conditions: Working only with suppliers who comply with local legislation, international labor standards, and prohibit all forms of forced labor, child labor, discrimination, or harassment.
- ▶ Ethics and integrity: Promoting fair business practices and rejecting all forms of corruption, fraud, or conflicts of interest in the supply chain.
- Environmental sustainability: Favoring suppliers who adopt environmentally friendly practices (emission reduction, waste management, responsible consumption of natural resources).
- Quality and safety: Selecting products and services that meet high standards of quality and safety.
- Local economy: Encouraging, whenever possible, the use of local suppliers to support the economic development of the communities in which we operate.

4. Implementation:

To deploy this policy, we will strive to:

- Integrate ESG (Environmental, Social, Governance) criteria into supplier consultations and selection.
- Regularly evaluate our partners and suppliers for compliance with this policy.
- Establish a reporting mechanism to declare any ethical breaches or non-compliance.
- Develop long-term relationships with responsible and transparent suppliers.

5. Responsibility and Monitoring:

SMTI's General Management is responsible for implementing this policy. Internal and external audits may be conducted to verify its application.
